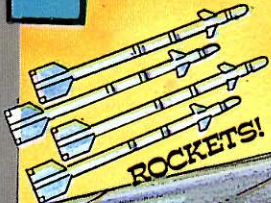
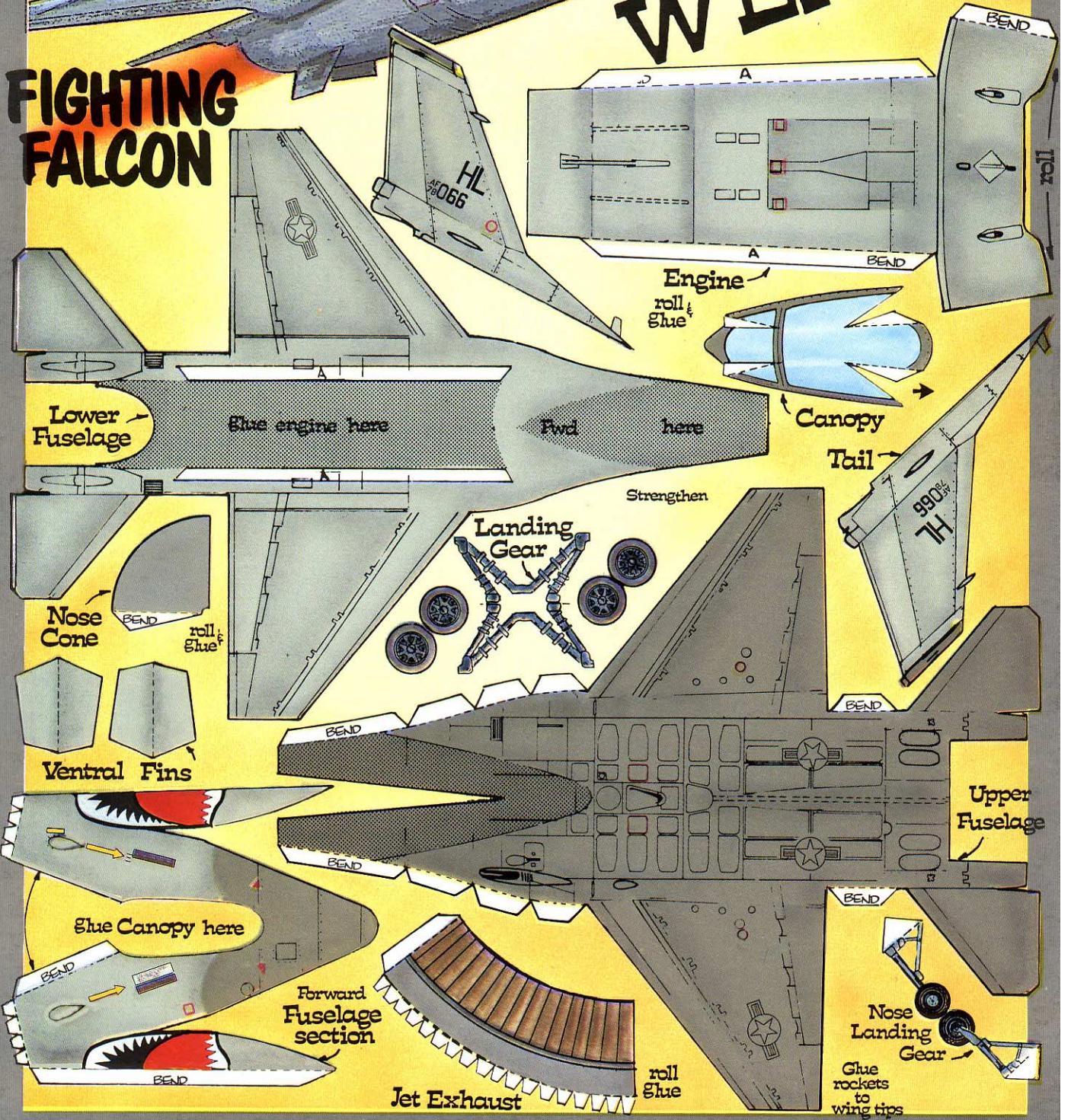

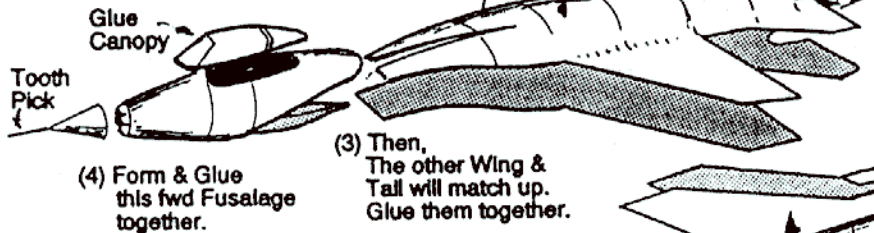

TOP VIEW

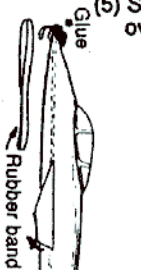


- Step (1) Glue Wing & Tail together on this side only.
- (2) Carefully roll Upper Fuselage

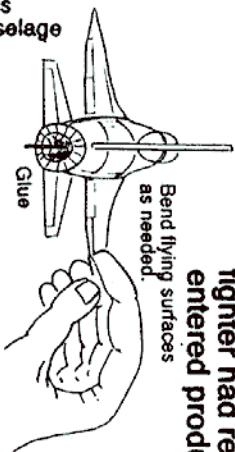
(4) Form & Glue this fwd Fuselage together.

(3) Then, The other Wing & Tail will match up. Glue them together.

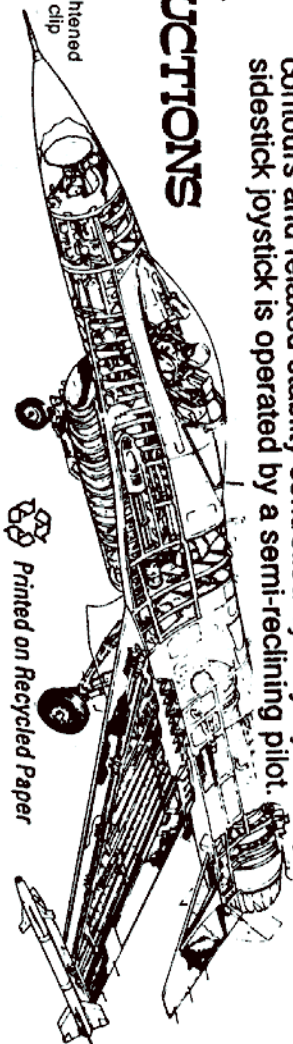
(5) Slide this over Fuselage

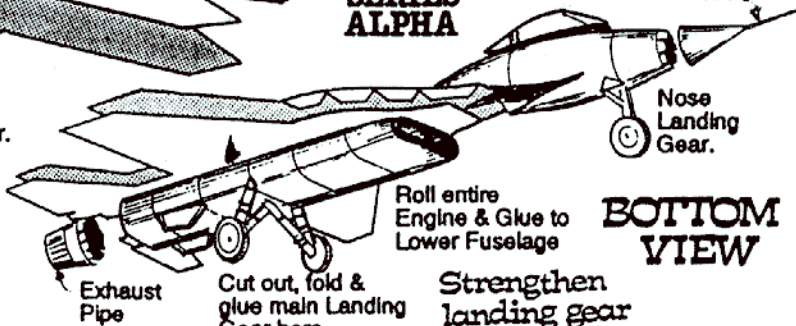
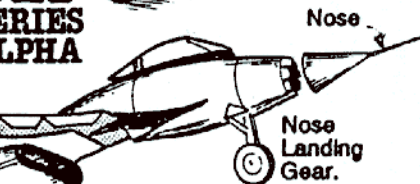


Bend flying surfaces as needed.

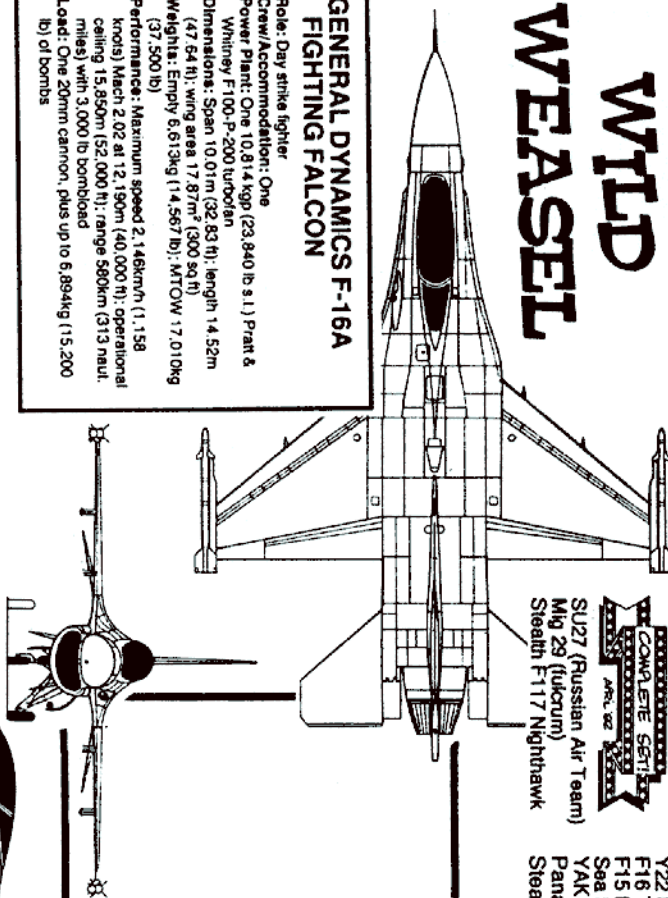

During the Vietnam War the U.S. Air Force saw that its fighters were in general handicapped by their size, weight and Mach 2 performance, all of these factors that eroded reliability and combat agility at increasingly common low and medium altitudes.

In 1975 it was announced that the competition for a new lightweight fighter had resulted in victory for a General Dynamics design that entered production as the single-seat F-16A and two-seat F-16B.

The type has gone on to become numerically the most important fighter in the inventory of the Western World. The type is based on blended contours and relaxed stability controlled by a fly-by-wire system whose sidestick joystick is operated by a semi-reclining pilot.
